

Listening Posts through February . . .

We have been talking about our upcoming "Listening Posts" since the beginning of the year. At the beginning of February, the posts will begin. A "listening post" is a small group gathering of ten (10) or less members meeting with the pastor for 60-90 minutes. The purpose for these posts is for Pr. Ramey to hear the stories of Grace members in order to ascertain (a) the "what was" (history) and (b) determine the "what is" (culture) of the congregation for the sake gaining a "reality check" about the mission and ministry of Grace Lutheran Church. All statements will be recorded, compiled, and significant "theme" will be shared with the congregation sometime in March.


Prompting Questions

As you think about participating in a "listening post," you may think to yourself, "What does he want to hear?" To help participants think about what they would like to share, the following "prompting questions" have been posted. They are in no particular order and you may elect to disregard them; they are offered as starting points for you to think through what you desire to say.

- [1] Do I believe God's best blessings are before us or behind us? Do we have a future or has God moved on?
- [2] What are my fondest memories about Grace? What are my saddest memories? As I reflect on my time at Grace, what brings a smile to my face or tears to my eyes?
- [3] How do we view and handle conflict that arises due to the differences we bring to the table? Are there any *unwritten rules* about how we deal (or, don't) with differences of opinion or people we disagree with?
- [4] What needs to *die* in order for us to *live*? Are there programs or ideas that may have been effective in the past, but now are limiting the health and growth of our congregation?
- [5] Does our church view the changing culture as a problem to be solved or as an opportunity to be embraced? What has changed in Midland over the past ten years? What kind of impact has it had on our community? Congregation?
- [6] What is the difference between *doing* church or *being* church? Do I feel that church is something I attend, or is it a lifestyle to be practiced?
- [7] **Do I feel confident inviting my non-churched friends to Grace congregation?** Why would you say "yes"? Why would you say "no"? What are the strengths of our church family that could benefit others? What are things that may hinder our ministry?

The "sign up" book is located outside the COMMUNITY ROOM. Please stop by and sign up for one of the open time slots. Each session is limited to ten (10) people; sign up one person per line. There are "reminder cards" (orange) for you to put down your date and time for the Listening Post you're attending.

Dear Bibleville Families,

Have you ever made these statements?

I didn't know anything about that!
I'm always the last to know!
I've never seen that before!

I'm talking about Bibleville Homework and its purpose in your family. Bibleville homework began over a year ago to give parents a way to interact with their children and share what they were learning in Bibleville. The homework is part of the Enduring Faith Curriculum we use in Bibleville. Each take-home sheet includes the Bible reference to the story, the Bible Verse for the week, a Scripture Snapshot of the story and a section called, "Taking it Home." This is YOUR homework to do with them. There's a question you can talk about "On the Go," one for at "Mealtimes," and one "Before Bed." There's also a simple activity to do sometime during the week if you have time. Building faith begins in the home and this is a great way to show your kids how important that is to you and your family.

Now that you know what Bibleville Homework is all about, what will you do? Please don't let the dog get it!

Our Baptismal Journey

"Christ's Life, and Love, and Light"

Open our eyes Lord to see Your love's intent, To know with minds and hearts its depth and height May thankfulness be days in service spent Reflection of Christ's life, and love, and light. (*LSB* 788)

As stewards enter the month of February, it is fitting that we look at the last stanza of the stewardship hymn, "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (*LSB* 788). It is in these words that we see that the heart of stewardship is indeed love. Love has flowed from our Lord to us in the person and work of Jesus Christ. This love is then to flow from us to others. Being a conduit of love is really the central task of what it means to be a steward. The Lord entrusts us with His love that reconciles us to Himself, so that we might be stewards of the Gospel reconciliation that is freely given through us to those around us.

If we don't see this love from God to us, then through us, to others, our eyes will be closed not just to the needs of those around us. They will also be closed to the very heart of the Gospel itself. This is why the hymnist prays that the Lord would "Open our eyes, Lord, to see Your love's intent, To know with minds and hearts its depth and height."

Only when we are immersed in God's Holy Word, washed in Holy Baptism's life-giving water and fed on the holy, precious, body and blood of Jesus in the Holy Supper, will the Spirit be able to open our eyes to see the Lord's loving intent for us, and those we know and love. Sin blinds us. It makes us think that we are the center of our world, and our pleasure is the key.

In the Word, the Lord shows us the depth and height of His love. The depth of that love is what moved Him from His throne in heaven into our world. There He would don our human flesh, walk the dusty roads of Palestine, and set His face toward Jerusalem. Once there we get to see the height of His love, as He is elevated on a Roman cross to die a death that we deserve. But that would not be the end. He would be lowered into a tomb for three days. On that third day we then see the heights of love ascended to in His resurrection. This resurrection is already ours too!

The depth and height of this love poured out on us by the Holy Spirit then is distributed through us to others. Christ's servant love is shown in our servant love. The hymn utters the prayer of every Christian steward:

May thankfulness be days in service spent Reflection of Christ's life, and love, and light.

This is the task for which stewards were originally created. Bearing the image of creation and redemption, we reflect Christ's love to those around us. The light of Christ shining through us to others is the true stewardship to which we are called. It takes place in our homes. It is lived out in our workplaces and classrooms. As we bear the life, love and light received in Word and Sacrament, we carry it out in service to our neighbor and for the glory of God!

Forgive us, Lord, when our stewardship of thankfulness is shallow or lacking! Fill us with Your life, love and light! Not just for us, but through us to those we know and love, that they may know Your life, love and light for them!



Fostering Hope

MAD Camp utilizes the expressive arts of Music, Art and Drama as tools of exploration and coping. Each day of camp includes opening and closing activities, discussion time and snacks.

Journey Camp



Journey Camp is exclusively fur children and teens who have previously attended the Hope Works course. This camp is designed as the next level in their grief work. This week of exploration introduces campers to the Forest of Fear, Challenge Mountain, the Ocean of Emotion, the City of Change, the Jungle of Anger and the Island of Hope.

Teen Camp is a special time, just for our teens. Adolescents who are rising 7th through 12th graders are invited to attend. We have designed this camp to navigate the work of grief as the participants are also navigating puberty and the rituals of growing up.



Tet the children come to me, and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God," Jesus says in Luke 18:16. God wants all His children to have faith in Him, yet sin and brokenness permeate the lives of His people. Children are orphaned, and families are ripped apart. Over the years, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) has reached out to care for God's precious children through the mercy ministries of congregations, missionaries and Recognized Service Organizations (RSOs).

Remember God's love and will for children and families as you pray:

- 1. for all Christians, that they would help and defend the orphan and widow, the poor and lonely, the helpless and oppressed.
- 2. The purification of Mary and the Presentation of Our Lord: for mothers, that they might rejoice in their vocation and raise their children in the Lord.
- 3. for adoption and foster-care agency workers, that they would make good and right decisions concerning what is best for all involved enabling them to find proper families and resources to

meet the needs of the children they serve.

- 4. for all children, that they might be brought to the waters of Baptism and taught God's Word.
- 5. Jacob (Israel), Patriarch, thank God for Jacob, through whom came the promise of the Messiah and the 12 tribes of Israel: for fathers, that they might raise their children in the Word.
- for men as they grow up, that they may be godly in their youth and their adult years.
- for orphanages around the world, that they might receive

- proper funding, food, resources and godly caregivers so that detection they can provide the best care we possible to the children entrusted are to them.
- 8. for orphanage workers, that they might be refreshed by Your Word and be good role models and teachers as they provide loving care to those in their charge.
- for all orphans, that they might find Christian families who will nurture them with the love and knowledge of Christ.
- 10. Silas, Fellow Worker of St. Peter and St. Paul, thank God for Silas, lesser known, but essential to the work of the Kingdom: for all church workers, that all might work as God calls them to serve Him.
- 11. for all foster children, that they might find peace among the chaos as they wait for a proper family to be established.

- 12. for all who suffer from domestic violence, that the Lord would deliver them from danger and comfort them with His peace and forgiveness.
- 13. Aquila, Priscilla, Apollos, thank God for these examples of earnest learning and meditation in the Word of God.
- 14. Valentine, Martyr, pray that the love of Christ might be the love celebrated above all loves.
- 15. Philemon and Onesimus: for all Christian workers and those in authority, that all might serve God in their vocations.
- 16. Philipp Melanchthon (birth), Confessor: thank God for the Augsburg Confession and the other writings of Melanchthon that proclaim the truth of the Gospel.
- 17. for all caregivers, that they might raise children in the truth faith.


