Worship Services Survey Results

During the month of April, a worship survey was carried out on behalf of the Board of Elders. There were twelve questions that came out of previous conversations over the worship life of Grace.

Statement 1: I feel that our worship services should be the Divine Services from

Lutheran Service Book.

Statement 2: I feel that our worship services should allow the use of *Creative Worship* from

the Lutheran Service Builder.

Statement 3: I feel that we should consider more contemporary worship elements in our

services.

Statement 4: I feel that our Sunday schedule should remain the same.

Statement 5: I feel that we should change our schedule to an *earlier* starting time.

Statement 6: I feel that we should change our schedule to a *later* starting time.

Statement 7: I feel that we should consider a *second Sunday service*.

Statement 8: I feel that the presence of screens or monitors would *distract* from our worship.

Statement 9: I feel that the presence of screens or monitors would *enhance* our worship.

Statement 10: I feel that having *lay members* read the Scriptures on Sunday is an acceptable


practice.

Statement 11: I feel that *only* the pastor and elders should serve as readers in our worship

service.

Statement 12: I would attend a midweek service during the summer months in our worship

service.



Based on these results, it is the consensus of the pastor and elders that we are in our "sweet spot" with worship services at this point and should simply maintain the quality and style of worship we have been conducting.

Update: From the door offerings that we held to raise funds for the equipment to allow us to offer Livestreaming of our weekly services, we received \$7,882. We thank everyone for their generous support! The initial proposal was for \$5,300, but due to the current tariffs on equipment from outside of the United States, the costs are 12.6% more - or a total of \$5,986. Any remaining funds will be used to offset additional costs of the project. It will be at least July before the equipment can be installed.



The Convention of the Texas District LCMS will be June 5-7, 2025. It will be held at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Clearlake (Houston). Pr. Ramey and Thomas Wolfmueller are our delegates. A new District President will be elected as well as District boards and Circuit Visitors. Please keep all delegates in your prayers as they travel to Houston.

Discovering Grace's Spiritual DNA . . .

Members of Grace congregation spent two Saturdays (April 26 & May 3) working to develop a Biblical Mission statement, a workable Vision statement, and foundational Values for our future mission and ministry as a Lutheran church. Together, the Mission, Vision, and Values form our "spiritual DNA," from which we can determine the "Why" of our ministry.

The MISSION answers the question: "Why do we exist?" Taking a look at the various "mission" and "commission" statements from the New Testament, participants set forth the following as our operating Mission statement: Go. Love. Christ. These three words summarize the overall mission and ministry.



Scripture References: Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:46-49; John 20:21; Acts 1:8; 1 Corinthians 2:3; 2 Corinthians 5:20-21; 2 Timothy 4:1-5; Hebrews 12:1-2; 1 Peter 2:9-10; 1 John 3:16.

The **VISION** answers the question: "How do we accomplish our purpose?" Reviewing the current Mission Statement in our Constitution, the group decided to "redefine" it as a clear statement of how Grace functions:

- ♣ Sharing His Grace♣ Living His Word
 - **Making Disciples**

The **VALUES** statement(s) answer the question: "What will we do?" Extending the previous work through Scripture and determining our "shared ministry values," three "values" were stated to prioritize Grace's Gospel work:

- ❖ Bible-centered preaching and teaching for all leading to a community of disciples and servants.
- Word and Sacraments regularly celebrated as God's means of grace.
- As God's people we reach out in His grace, loving, seeking, and welcoming people in Jesus' name.

Continuing in our Transitional process, this "Spiritual DNA" will help us focus our efforts as a congregation and help us to identify a pastoral profile for our future shepherd.



Our Transitional Task Force begins its work . . .

A Transitional Task Force has been formed. Their focus is collecting and analyzing all data and survey results to complete the documentation required by the District President's office for calling a new resident pastor. Once everything has been gathered, they will present the call documents to the congregation for its approval and send them to the District Office.




Each were presented with a quilt handmade by our Grace Quilters who Congratulated them and wished each of them a bright and successful future!



LUTHERAN SCHOOLS — JULY 1-15

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) School Ministry serves as a national voice for Lutheran schools, upholding the standards of Christ-centered schools that are academically strong and respectfully operated. Nationwide, there are 1,992 LCMS schools, which include 1,127 early childhood centers, 778 elementary schools and 87 high schools.

Remember God's work in Lutheran schools as you pray:

- for the children attending Lutheran schools, that their eyes, ears, hearts and minds would be open to God's Word.
- 2. for Lutheran school teachers, that they would correctly divide and deliver Law and Gospel to students through real-life applications each day.
- 3. for Lutheran school principals, who lead people to passionately embrace the witness our schools provide to the community. Pray that pastors, principals, directors and teachers would work together in Godpleasing unity.

- 4. for pastors, who champion the Kingdom work happening in our schools. Pray that pastors would be excited to be an integral part of their school's ministry and the teaching of the children.
- 5. for the ability of Lutheran schools to serve every child in their care. Ask that the Lord would provide the means to help schools serve children who have disabilities, who have experienced trauma or who come from families with limited resources.
- 6. for Lutheran schools that are struggling to fill empty seats. Pray that God would revitalize their ministries, energize their staff members and bring more children through their doors.

- 7. for parents who support our Lutheran schools with their time, talents and treasures. Give thanks for their dedication to the mission of the school.
- 8. for daily opportunities for our teachers and staff to show God's mercy, love and forgiveness both inside and outside of the classroom. Pray that God would maintain our ability to practice our faith in Lutheran schools.
- 9. for church members who tell the story of their Lutheran school, that their recommendation might lead more students through the school's doors.
- 10. for the many non-Christians and exchange students who are coming to our schools. Pray that God would work through the Gospel that they will have faith in Jesus.

- 11. for first-year teachers, that they may apply their gifts to demonstrate grace and mercy. Pray that God would give them strength and patience.
- 12. for our early childhood centers that introduce young families to the saving love of Jesus. Pray that they are a faithful witness to the littlest of God's children and their families.
- 13. for courageous Lutheran schools willing to take calculated risks that will result in significant rewards for students. Give the leaders of these schools wisdom in their decisions.
- 14. for comfort and healing for school faculty and students during times of injury, illness and loss.
- 15. for God to raise up wise and gifted leaders who are willing to serve in administrative roles at Lutheran schools.

Beneficiaries: Frequently Asked Questions

1. What types of investments are eligible for beneficiaries?

Individual investments and Joint Tenants with Right of Survivorship (JTWROS) accounts are eligible for beneficiary designations.

2. What types of investments are not eligible for beneficiaries?

Custodial investments, trusts, or business accounts are not eligible for beneficiary designations.

3. Does the beneficiary have to be a person?

No! You can name a church or any organization as your beneficiary, including the Texas CEF Capital Fund if you wish your money to continue supporting our ministry.

4. Will the beneficiaries have access to my investments before my passing?

No, beneficiaries are not owners of the investments. They will not receive any information regarding the investment(s) until Texas CEF is formally notified of the investment owner's passing.
