New Bible Study began TODAY: Church and Ministry.

Pr. Ramey began a new study on the relationship between congregations and their pastor based on C.F.W. Walther's, *Church and Ministry*. With a new start in a new land, the forefathers of the LCMS were immediately faced with the challenge of defining what their church and its ministry were going to look like. Walther, a young pastor who was given the role of leader, had to define what church and ministry need to be in accordance to Scripture and the Confessions. His *Church and Ministry* was adopted as one of the only two *doctrinal statements* that define the LCMS's theology and practice. It is the basis for forming congregations as spiritual communities and is instructive for Grace congregation as it begins looking to its future mission and ministry. 

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" (Matthew 21:9).
